



## British Dressage Selection Policy For P/J/YR/Ch CDI/CDIOs 2024

### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 This is the British Dressage Selection Policy for FEI P/J/YR/Ch CDI / CDIO competitions in 2024. The athlete and horse / pony combinations will be selected by the British Dressage (“**BD**”) Selectors (“**the Selectors**”) in accordance with this Policy and will be entered by BD.
- 1.2 This Selection Policy is compiled in consultation with the BD Board of Directors, BD International Director (“**ID**”), Selectors and BD Chief Executive (“**CEO**”)
- 1.3 The Selectors are entitled in exceptional circumstances to amend or revise this Selection Policy where they reasonably consider it necessary to do so to achieve the objectives of the Selection Policy set out in Section 2 below.
  - 1.3.1 The amendments or revisions to this Selection Policy must be approved in writing by the BD Chief Executive (CEO) and the ID.
  - 1.3.2 The amended or revised clauses will be communicated to all U21 international athletes in a manner directed by the ID and Selectors, and the full amended or revised Selection Policy will be published on the BD website.

### 2. Objectives

- 2.1 The Selectors shall select (in accordance with this Selection Policy) the athlete and horse / pony combinations that in their view will most likely maximise the potential to achieve the objectives set out in this section of the Selection Policy (“**the Objectives**”)
- 2.2 **Primary Objective:** To optimise preparation for those athlete and horse / pony combinations identified as having potential to achieve a team place at the relevant FEI Under 21 European Dressage Championships 2024, through competition in appropriate international competitions.
- 2.3 **Secondary Objective:** To offer opportunities for development and progression through international competition to those athlete and horse / pony combinations considered to have the potential to become future FEI Under 21 European Championship team contenders.
- 2.4 **Tertiary Objective:** To provide athlete and horse / pony combinations with the opportunity to compete in international competitions, where possible, to develop their experience and support performance progression.

### **3. Selection Panel**

- 3.1 The athletes representing Great Britain will be selected by the British Dressage voting Selectors.
- 3.2 The Selectors have been appointed by the British Dressage (BD) Board based on having the knowledge and expertise required to select athletes to represent Great Britain at this level and will be free of all vested interests / conflicts of interest, in so far as is possible.
- 3.3 The Selection Panel shall comprise the following positions:
- Chief Selector – Nikki Herbert (voting)  
Selector – Richard Baldwin (voting)  
Selector – Stephen Arnett (voting)
- International Director (ID) – Judy Harvey (casting vote only, as per clause 3.5)
- In attendance (non-voting)  
Performance Manager – Caroline Bell  
Secretariat – U21 International Officer
- 3.4 All Selectors will have equal voting rights. They will use their discretion honestly and with due integrity, having regard to and acting in compliance with any applicable BD and BEF codes of conduct and/or code of ethics in force.
- 3.5 Decisions must be reached by a majority vote and with no abstentions unless a Selector is required to abstain due to a declared conflict of interest. In the event of a majority decision not being achieved or possible, or due to a declared conflict of interest, the ID will have the casting vote.
- 3.6 The Selection Panel will be provided with relevant scores in advance (obtained from the BD and FEI website), and relevant performance evidence to support them in their selection decisions. The information will be prepared by the Performance Manager and U21 International Officer.

### **4. Eligibility for Consideration for Selection**

- 4.1 Athlete and horse / pony combinations are eligible for consideration for selection provided that:
- The athlete is a British Citizen with a current British passport valid for a minimum of six months after the date of competition.
  - The athlete is a full and active member of British Dressage, and not subject to suspension under BD rules.
  - The horse / pony is fully registered with British Dressage
  - The legal horse / pony owner is a Full (competing or non-competing) member of British Dressage.
  - Both athlete and horse/pony have the appropriate and current FEI license(s) issued via the application process undertaken by the British Equestrian Federation (BEF), in accordance with Article 113 and 117 of the FEI General Regulations; and they have satisfied all eligibility and qualification criteria under the BD, BEF and FEI Dressage rules and regulations for the competition.
- 4.2 In advance of any selection the BD U21 International Officer will ensure that each athlete and horse / pony combination available for selection is eligible to represent Great Britain based on the eligibility criteria above.

## **5. Selection Criteria for International Competitions 2024**

- 5.1 The Selectors will act as experts and are entitled, within the boundaries of the Selection Policy and selection criteria, to use their absolute discretion to select the best athlete and horse / pony combinations to fulfil the Objectives of this policy.
- 5.2 Minimum performance criteria for CDI/CDIOs:
- 68% or above – FEI Pony Team Test, FEI Pony Individual Test
  - 68% or above – FEI Junior Team Test, FEI Junior Individual Test
  - 68% or above – FEI Young Rider Team Test, FEI Young Rider Individual Test
  - 68% or above – FEI Children Team Test (final technical mark), FEI Children on Horses Individual Test (final technical mark)
- 5.3 A Minimum Performance Score (MPS) can be achieved at any of the following competitions in the specific FEI Youth Team or Individual classes:
- CDI/CDIO – Domestic or International
  - BD Premier League Show
  - BD High Profile Show
  - BD Youth Foundation Academy Test Riding where an FEI Judge is judging
- 5.4 **Combinations based abroad**
- Athlete and horse / pony combinations must have achieved the Minimum Performance Score outlined in Para 5.2 above at a CDI/CDIO or at an equivalent National Competition, subject to prior agreement with and subsequent competition video review by the Selectors.
- 5.5 Combinations that have represented GB at FEI European Championships can be selected the following season for CDI/CDIO competitions. This can include those moving up from Juniors to Young Riders, if this is considered by the selectors to fulfil the Objectives of this policy. This will be subject to the Selector's review and approval of competition video evidence provided at the required level.
- 5.6 The Minimum Performance Score must have been achieved in the six calendar months prior to the Definite Entries date of the CDI / CDIO that the athlete and horse / pony combination is in consideration for.
- 5.7 For domestic CDIs Selectors can exercise their discretion when considering minimum performance scores to maximise the opportunity to fill the full quota of places allocated.
- 5.8 Achievement of the Minimum Performance Score (see Section 5.2 and 5.3) does not guarantee selection.
- 5.9 All tests to be ridden in accordance with FEI rules.
- 5.10 No whips may be used in any minimum performance score tests.

## **6. Continuing Performance Criteria**

- 6.1 For the duration of this Selection Policy any athlete and horse / pony combination competing in a CDI/CDIO must achieve / have achieved a minimum percentage of 66% in either the Team Test or Individual Test at that competition.
- 6.2 Failure to achieve the minimum percentage in two consecutive CDI/CDIO will result in a reassessment before the athlete and horse / pony combination can be selected for future CDI/CDIOs. Athlete and horse / pony combinations will be required to fulfil Section 5.2 or 5.3 again before they can be considered for entry into a future CDI/CDIO.
- 6.3 Selection for a consecutive CDI/CDIO, mentioned in 6.2 above, is subject to the Minimum Performance Criteria laid out in Para 5.6; i.e., this must be within the six calendar months prior to the Definite Entries date of the CDI/CDIO the athlete / horse / pony is in consideration for.
- 6.4 Scores gained in a Consolation Test (Team or Individual) or Freestyle to Music Test at that competition will not be taken into account.

## **7. Selection Process**

- 7.1 Following the achievement of the Minimum Performance Score a combination will be added to a list held by the U21 International Officer of those eligible for consideration for a CDI/CDIO.
- 7.2 Upon receipt of the schedule for a CDI/CDIO (or four weeks prior to the show, whichever is sooner), the U21 International Officer will email the eligible athlete and horse / pony combinations to request expressions of interest for that show. These expressions of interest will then be forwarded to the Selectors for their consideration. Selection remains at the discretion of Selectors and is not guaranteed. Athletes new to international level should be aware that the Selectors' preference will be to send the combination to a domestic CDI for their first international competition.
- 7.3 The Selectors will select the requisite number of athlete and horse / pony combinations for each show in accordance with the Objectives of this Selection Policy. The number will be dictated by the FEI Schedule and accompanying FEI Dressage rules. If applicable, a wait/reserve list in order will be drawn up.
- 7.4 Athletes able to gain private invitations to specific FEI CDI P/J/YR/Ch competitions should inform the International Officer if that option is available to them. They may be requested to take up that option to access additional places. Private invitations will not take priority over an athlete and horse / pony combination selected by the Selectors to compete at any given CDI/CDIO.
- 7.5 Athletes will be informed if they have been selected to compete at a CDI/CDIO (at Definite Entries stage) by the U21 International Officer (via email), within the time frames indicated in the show schedule and/or FEI entry system.
- 7.6 Athletes should confirm their acceptance with the U21 International Officer, who will be responsible for submitting the entry on the FEI system prior to the close of Definite Entries. Athletes are responsible for their own costs, as indicated within the show schedule.

- 7.7 Should an athlete and horse / pony combination have to withdraw prior to the Definite Entries stage, the U21 International Officer will contact the next combination on the wait/reserve list.

## **8. Selection criteria for BD U21 International Pathway Squad 2024**

### **8.1 Minimum criteria for Squad inclusion:**

- A combination must have achieved a minimum of two scores at 68% in the relevant FEI Team or Individual Test at a High Profile or Premier League show; or at Foundation Academy Test Riding where an FEI Judge is judging.
- In the Selector's professional opinion, there must be clear potential for European team inclusion, either in the current competition year, or in future years.

- 8.2 Inclusion on the Squad gives priority to a combination for CDI/CDIO selection and priority for test Riding / Training dates, as organised by British Dressage, over a qualified but non-squadded combination. Only current Squad combinations are entitled to wear full BD U21 apparel.

- 8.3 Where a breach of the minimum performance criteria has been incurred due to a veterinary issue, continued inclusion on the squad will be subject to review (including video) by the Selectors and may require the combination to requalify, as per Section 6 of this policy, before they can continue on the Squad.

- 8.4 Inclusion on the Squad is on a rolling calendar year basis; inclusion is subject to FEI age category related criteria and ceases on attainment of the upper age limit for each level. Future inclusion is then subject to the criteria in Section 6 of the CDI/CDIO Selection Policy.

## **9. Withdrawals**

- 9.1 Once an athlete and horse / pony combination has committed to compete at an international show (via email to the U21 International Officer) they are expected to compete. However, if they find at any time that they have to withdraw, for whatever reason, they are obliged to notify the BD U21 International Officer and the Performance Manager (PM) immediately.

- 9.2 The U21 International Officer is responsible for withdrawing the athlete's entry on the FEI system.

- 9.3 After Definite Entries have taken place, and as per FEI rules, a veterinary / medical certificate will be required before a withdrawal is accepted. Any withdrawal costs incurred are the responsibility of the athlete.

## **10. Other Considerations in Support of the Selection Policy**

### **10.1 Conflicts of Interest**

- 10.1.1 To protect the integrity of the Selection Process, Selectors shall not take any measure, nor exercise any influence, in relation to a matter where any conflict of interest or any other conflict exists or is perceived to exist.

10.1.2 Selectors must therefore take all reasonable steps to avoid situations where there may be a potential conflict of interest, whether that is a real or perceived conflict of interest.

10.1.3 All conflicts of interest will be declared to the BD CEO and recorded by the U21 International Officer, so that they can be managed in an appropriate manner. The BD CEO will proactively manage any conflicts on a regular basis and throughout the selection process to ensure the integrity of the selection decisions.

## 10.2 Confidentiality

10.2.1 It is vitally important for the integrity of the Selection Policy and out of respect for the athletes, parents / guardians, owners, Selectors, staff, and other parties, that there is a high degree of confidentiality relating to any information which may have a bearing on selection.

10.2.2 Any member of the Selection Panel, whether voting or non-voting, who breaks this confidentiality may be removed from the Selection Panel. All selection related conversations and discussions will be confidential.

## 10.3 Code of Conduct

10.3.1 Athletes, parents / guardians, owners, trainers, grooms, and athletes' support teams are expected to abide by any BD and/or British Equestrian Athlete/Parent Code of Conduct that may be in force. Any current Code of Conduct/Team Charter can be found on the BD website at: [www.britishdressage.co.uk/our-sport/international-teams/youth-international/selection-and-squads](http://www.britishdressage.co.uk/our-sport/international-teams/youth-international/selection-and-squads).

10.3.2 Athletes, parents / guardians, owners, trainers, grooms, and athlete support teams are expected to behave in a manner that does not negatively affect performance or bring the sport into disrepute.

10.3.3 Any breach in the BD and/or British Equestrian Charter and/or Athlete/Parent Code of Conduct by any athlete, parent/guardian, or a member of their support teams, including the misuse of social media, will result in disciplinary action and may lead to exclusion from any international involvement.

## 10.4 Clean Sport

10.4.1 Selection is subject to compliance with FEI and BEF Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Rules, and FEI, BEF and WADA rules on anti-doping. BEF equine anti-doping and controlled medication rules (BEFAR) and BEF human anti-doping rules. The current equine and human prohibited substances lists can be found on the BEF website: [www.britishequestrian.org.uk](http://www.britishequestrian.org.uk). ## 10.5 Cancellation / Postponement

10.5.1 In the event of cancellation, the relevant parties will be notified immediately. In the event of postponement, a situation might arise where new combinations may need to be selected, in which case all parties will be notified and normal procedure for selection will be followed.

10.5.2 In the event of exceptional circumstances (force majeure) beyond BD's control, such as disease outbreak in horses or humans, war, or terrorism, the British Dressage Board, in consultation with the ID and BD Chief Executive, reserves the right to make the decision either to change the Selection Policy or the procedure, which might include withdrawing individuals from competition.

## 10.6 **Point of Contact**

10.6.1 The International Director is the key point of contact relating to this Selection Policy. The point of contact for riders wishing to discuss their intended competition plans is the U21 Performance Manager.

## 10.7 **Finance**

10.7.1 All international competitions will be entirely self-funded by athletes. Chefs d'Equipe may be appointed to travel to international competitions to provide additional support to combinations at the ID / PM's discretion, in consultation and with agreement of BD CEO.

## 10.8 **Home Trainers**

10.8.1 Home trainers will be expected to work under the direction of, and in co-operation with, the nominated Coach Advisor for the benefit of the athlete and horse / pony combination. To enable the home trainer and Coach Advisor to achieve the best results, it is anticipated that eligible riders based in the UK will attend the officially organised training camps, ideally with their home trainers.

## 11 **Appeals Process and Procedures**

11.1 Athletes have the right to appeal against a CDI/CDIO selection decision of the Selectors, but only on the grounds that the Selectors have failed to comply with this Policy or have made a decision that no rational body of competent selectors could have reasonably reached.

11.2 An appeal must be made by submitting notice in writing to the BD Chief Executive, in accordance with the BEF Selection Appeal Rules (the "Appeal Process"), within 48 hours of the relevant athlete being informed of the Selector's decision.

11.3 The BD Chief Executive will, on receipt of the notice of appeal, seek to bring together all parties for a without prejudice discussion that may, if all are agreed, take the form of facilitated mediation.

11.4 For the avoidance of doubt the Appeal Process shall continue to run during the course of such discussion. However, in the event that both parties notify the BEF (within 48 hours of receipt of the notice of appeal) that such discussion / mediation has resolved the appeal, the Appeal Process shall be stayed.
